

BURN PERMITS: WHO, WHAT, WHERE AND WHEN

If you live in the unincorporated portion of Western Nevada County burn permits are required as of May 1st. Burn permits can be obtained at any of the following locations (*call first to verify hours of issuance and staffing levels*):

AIR POLLUTION PERMITS ARE REQUIRED

Anyone who desires to engage in any *non-residential* open burning must obtain a burn permit from the Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District 365 days a year. Non-residential burning includes, but is not limited to, such categories as agricultural burning, range improvement burning, fire hazard reduction burning, contractors who clear land for development and any burning associated with a timber harvest of any size. Permits must be obtained from the Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District at:

In the south county area: **268-1023**

NOTE: Open burning is banned year-round within the **city limits** of Grass Valley.
