AIR POLLUTION PERMITS ARE ALWAYS REQUIRED IF:

You desire to engage in any *non-residential* open burning. Non-residential open burning includes, but is not limited to, such categories as agricultural burning, range improvement burning, fire hazard reduction burning, anyone who clears land for any development purposes and any burning associated with a timber harvest of any size. Such permits are required 365 days per year. Permits must be obtained from the Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District at:

Be sure to call the **Burn Day Recorder** every single day on which you hope to burn!

If you live west of Donner Summit, the Burn Day Recorder number is: 274-7928

NOTE: Open burning is banned year-round within the *city limits* of Grass Valley and Nevada City.
