PERSONS DESIRING TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Agenda Description: Authorize Board and Executive Director to sign Agreements to grant FARMER funding as attached.

Background:

Funding for the FARMER grant program is provided by the California Air Resources Board. The program is administered by the Placer County Air Pollution Control District. The Placer County APCD chooses which projects get money and how much money those projects get. Those decisions are based on the air quality merits of the individual projects, specifically, how much pollution is reduced for the least amount of money, or "cost effectiveness", and whether those projects benefit low-income or disadvantaged communities. Placer County APCD distributes the grant awards to the local Air Districts that are under contract with the Placer County APCD.

The contracts for the grant awards are administered by the local Air Districts. The role of the local Air District is to help the applicants fill out their grant applications. That includes help with wording, with choosing high value projects, with technical data and documentation and help with navigating the grant application process. Once a project has been awarded grant money, the local Air District is responsible for putting that grantee under contract with the District. The local District ensures that the grantee complies with all the conditions in the contract and adheres to all the pre, post and dismantling inspection schedules. The Air District holds the grant money in its account until such time that the grantee is ready to purchase their new equipment. Once all the inspections have been performed, the Air District will provide the grantee with their grant award. The Air District also fills out all the reports required by the FARMER program and ensures that the grantees continue to adhere to the terms of their grant contract over the 5-year life of the project. The primary responsibility of the grantee is to use their new equipment the same number of annual hours as the old equipment that was replaced. At the November 27, 2023, Board Meeting, there were not enough votes for a quorum for the following proposed project:

Agenda Description: Approval of Amendment 1 of the Grant Agreement between the District and California Air Resources Board for the FY 21/22 and FY 22/23 Wood Smoke Reduction Program (G21-WSRP-17-1).

Summary:

The Woodsmoke Reduction Program (Program) is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide program that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment-particularly in disadvantaged communities. The Program as implemented at the air pollution control district or the air quality management districts.

The purpose of Amendment 1 is to extend the time of the project and to add additional funding. The agreement was modified November 17, 2023 to add 2022-23 appropriation funds. Northern Seirra AQMD has been approved to receive \$512,470 for implementation and administration funds.

The District will continue to work with six other air districts as last year in a "regionally consistent" change-out program. Districts are limited to a maximum of \$5,000 for Enhanced or \$2,500 for Standard devices per property or household for qualifying devices to household in disadvantaged or low-income communities or tribal lands. There is a maximum cap of \$5,000 for any enhanced change-out incentive meeting the requirements for an exceptional circumstance.

Approve Amendment 1 of the Wood Smoke Reduction Program FY21/22 and FY22/23 Grant and approve Resolution #2023-12.

Whereas, the Woodsmoke Reduction Program (WRP) is part of California's Climate Investments, a statewide group that puts billions of Cap and Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and environment – particularly disadvantaged communities and

Whereas, the WRP is a Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF) funded program designed to replace high-polluting, uncertified woodstoves, wood inserts, and fireplaces used for primary home heating with cleaner burning, more efficient home devices; and

Whereas, the Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District has been approved by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) for a grant under the WRP; and

Whereas, the District is accepting \$512,470 of funds under the WRP for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

Whereas, CARB requires a Board resolution authorizing the Air Pollution Control Officer (APCO) to sign the Grant Agreement and accept funding; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District Board as follows:

- 1. The Board authorizes the APCO to sign the WSRP grant agreement with CARB and to execute all other necessary documents to implement and carry out the purposes of this resolution.
- 2. The Board does hereby approve the acceptance of the \$512,470 of funds under the WSRP for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement.
- 3. The Board hereby authorizes the Interim APCO to accept any unallocated and awarded funds to the District under the WSRP Grant Agreement.

SB 856 appropriated \$2 million dollars to CARB for local air districts to support the implementation of SB 901 and SB 1260 by implementing their smoke management programs, including training, travel, deployment of air monitors, and public outreach.

The purpose of Amendment 2 is to extend the Grant Agreement end date, add FY 23/24 funds, and make other minor changes to Exhibit A and B. This amended grant has awarded the District \$225,000 to cover FY21/22, FY22/23 and FY23/24.

NORTHERN SIERRA AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT RESOLUTION #2023-13

In the Matter of: Authorization to accept funds for The Prescribed Burn Reporting and Monitoring Support Program (PBRM) from the California Air Resources Board (CARB) in the amount of \$225,000 for FY 22/23.

Whereas, Local air districts operate smoke management program which are intended to manage emissions from the use of fire, which includes the use of fire for residential burning, agricultural burning, and prescribed fire on the landscape; and

Whereas, In 2018, the Legislature passed, and the Governor signed, several bills to improve forest resiliency and to reduce the risk of wildfires in California; and

Whereas, Senate Bill (SB) 901 addresses numerous issues concerning wildfire prevention, response and recovery; and provides authorization of \$200 million in funding per year to Cal Fire for healthy forests and fire prevention; and

Whereas, SB 1260 requires the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) and the California Air Resources Board (CARB), in coordination with local air districts, to develop and fund a program, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to enhance air quality and smoke monitoring, and to provide a public awareness campaign regarding prescribed burns. The program shall include adequate funding, upon appropriation by the Legislature, for local air district participation and implementation costs; and

Whereas, SB 856 appropriates \$2 million to CARB for local air districts to support the implementation of SB901 and SB1260 related to air monitoring of prescribed fires and public outreach;

Whereas, CARB is proposing that approximately \$1 million of these funds be made available through direct grants to local air districts to implement their smoke management programs, to enhance air quality and smoke monitoring, and to provide public awareness regarding prescribed burns; and that a portion of the remaining approximately \$1 million be made available to local districts, on a reimbursement basis, through a contract with the California Air Pollution Control Officers Association (CAPCOA), for costs associated with training, travel, and deployment of air monitors in support of the use of prescribed fire by land managers; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District Board hereby authorizes the acceptance of funds from CARB for implementation of the air district's Smoke Management Program, as well as for support of air District activities associated with prescribed burning and smoke management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Northern Sierra Air District Board of Directors hereby authorize the Air Pollution Control Officer to negotiate, sign and amend, as needed future agreements and contracts related to these activities, and to accept funds and to implement associated projects.
