THE PERMITTEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR COMPLYING WITH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS

- 1. This permit is valid only on "Burn Days" as designated by the Air Pollution Control Officer. Call the Burn Day Recorder each day before you burn. Do not allow piles to burn into a No-Burn Day.
- 2. Do not burn freshly cut, green vegetation. Allow a minimum of 3 to 6 weeks between cutting and burning (6 weeks for materials over 6 inches thick).
- 3. Arrange burn piles loosely and in a manner that facilitates efficient burning.
- 4. Only light piles that are reasonably free of dirt and moisture.
- 5. Burn only vegetation. Do not burn plywood, painted or treated wood, plastic, metal, rubber, cloth, adhesives, petroleum wastes, vinyl, carcasses of dead animals, manure, construction debris or other garbage.
- 6. Only those burn piles that can reasonably be expected to completely burn within the following 24 hours shall be ignited in any one day.
- 7. All open outdoor fires shall comply with applicable local, county, and State regulations.
- 8. This permit is valid only for the location specified as the "Location of Burning Site" on this permit.
- 9. This permit or a copy thereof shall be available at the burn site for review by any Air District or fire agency personnel upon request.
- 10. A responsible party must be in attendance and in control of the burn at all times.
- 11. This permit may be revoked or suspended by the Air Pollution Control Officer for violation of any conditions of this permit or at his or her discretion.
- 12. All burns shall be as hot and clean as reasonably possible, with minimal smoke.
- 13. Burning shall be immediately curtailed, mitigated or extinguished if smoke is drifting into a populated area or creating a public nuisance.
- 14. The permittee agrees to extinguish any and all of his or her burn piles upon the request of any Air District personnel or any fire agency personnel.

AIR POLLUTION PENALTIES

Pursuant to the California Health and Safety Code, Section 42400 et. seq., any person who emits an air contaminant in violation of any applicable part of the Health and Safety Code, or any rule, regulation, permit or order of the state board or of a district may be subject to the following maximum monetary penalty and/or duration of imprisonment in the county jail. In addition to these penalties, the cost of extinguishing any unauthorized open outdoor fires may be imposed on any person violating Health and Safety Code §41800 (Prohibited burning) or §41852 (Permit required). Each day during any portion of which a violation occurs is a separate offense.

Violation that is willful and intentional, or is committed with reckless disregard for risk, and which results in great bodily injury to, or death of, any person (public offense)	\$250,000	1 Year
